Markup of the FY 2010 Budget for the Department of Homeland
Security.**

Subcommittee Markup

Today the House Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on Homeland Security marked up and ordered reported their bill on the FY 2010 appropriations for the Department of Homeland Security. The bill includes \$42.6 billion for the Department of Homeland Security. Of this amount \$7.4 billion is for the Federal Emergency Management Agency, \$390 million more than in FY 2009 and \$118 million more than the President's request. There were no amendments offered, but amendments are expected in the Full Appropriations Committee markup.

Full Committee markup scheduled

On Friday, June 12, the Full Appropriations Committee will markup the Homeland Security bill and the Legislative Branch bill. The markup is currently scheduled for 9:00 a.m. and is to be web cast on the Committee's website at <http://appropriations.house.gov/>. (To watch, select the Full Committee markup from the list under events.)

Highlights:

Emergency Management Performance Grants

- \$330 million, an increase of \$15 million over the request.
- Retained as a separate account. (President's budget would have combined it with other grants in the State and Local Programs account).
- Chairman Price's statement referred to EMPG as "our one true all-hazards grant program."

Emergency Operations Centers

- \$40 million, President did not request any funds.
- Earmarked \$39,535,500 for specific EOCs.

PreDisaster Mitigation

- \$100 million, \$50 million less than President's request, \$10 million more than appropriated in FY 2009
- Earmarked \$24,786,064 for projects

Flood Map Modernization

- \$220 million, same as request.

State Homeland Security Program

- \$950 million, same as request

Urban Area Security Initiative

- \$887 million, same as request

Emergency Food and Shelter

- \$200 million, \$100 million more than request

Metropolitan Medical Response System

- \$40 million , same as request

Firefighter Assistance Grants

- Retained as a separate account
- Fire Grant program-- \$380 million, \$210 million more than request, but \$185 million less than FY 2009
- SAFER Act Grants--\$420 million, the request level.
