**Mr. Fluman is an employee of FEMA and works at the National Emergency Training Center (NETC) in Emmitsburg, Maryland. He has been a part of the Emergency Management Institute (EMI) since its inception in 1982. He has lead the development and training for literally thousands of emergency managers, elected and appointed officials and the first responders. He has been responsible for the development of the Integrated Emergency Management (IEMC) curriculum and individual training courses provided at EMI. The attached essay explores the specifics in additional detail. The entire program is supported by funding from the U.S Department of Homeland Security.**

**The Emergency Management Institute is the premier emergency training facility in the nation and has provided basic and advanced training in a simulated environment that emulates real-life disasters and emergencies. This unique training brings together employees from all disciplines in government, industry, private sector, non-profits and support organizations. By bringing all of these partners together into a single location, they are exposed to a series of real-time functional exercises that are driven by block lectures and team building sessions. Mr. Fluman is and has been responsible for the overall development, implementation, growth and success of the program offered by EMI.**

**This is difficult to quantify since EMI has been offering comprehensive training since 1982. Mr. Fluman is responsible for the delivery of nearly 60 Integrated Emergency Management courses annually that provide training for about 4,000 people every year. The class is supported by 2 or 3 FEMA personnel and up to 10 contract adjunct instructors who are recognized subject matter experts in their particular discipline. **Initially, FEMA staff, volunteers, community members and subject matter experts were brought together to develop this program. Additionally, this same combinations os skills and talents has been brought together periodically to refine and update the program so as to keep it relevant and current. Mr. Fluman is a firm believer that the federal government doesn't always know what is best for local and state governments in an emergency and that you need to be in continual contact with individuals that have their feet on the ground in emergency situations in order to keep the program at a high level of quality.**
