

Career Bio – Perron Goodyear

Since August 2016 Perron Goodyear has served as the Emergency Disaster Services Director for The Salvation Army's Canada & Bermuda Territory. Prior to his current role Perron spent 8 years with the Army's Ontario Great Lakes Division serving in capacities which included Divisional Emergency Disaster Services Director, Public Relations & Development Representative and Divisional Director of Marketing & Communications.



Perron's specialties include incident management, crisis intervention and communications. He has served as The Salvation Army's Incident Commander at numerous incidents, including response to the Goderich tornado in 2011, as well as on the Army's Incident Command team in Galveston, Texas in October 2008 following Hurricane Ike. He also assisted in establishing The Salvation Army's Incident Command Team and served as Operations & Logistics Chief for the Southern Alberta Flood Response in 2013. In July 2015 he served as Public Information Officer for The Salvation Army's response to Saskatchewan wildfires and most recently he was deployed as Incident Commander for The Salvation Army's response to the 2016 wildfire in Alberta.

Perron currently serves on the board of directors for the Canadian Risk & Hazard Network (CRHNet) and as a member of the Canadian Tri-Services Emergency Management Committee. He has previously served on the International Association of Emergency Managers Canada Council board as Director of Communications & Marketing.

Daughter, Robyn, is in her third year at York University's Glendon College, completing her BA in International Studies and a Certificate of Bilingualism.
